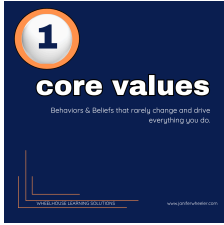

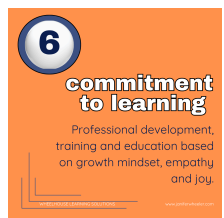

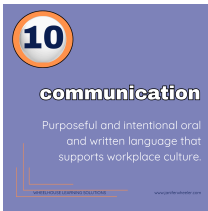

Quick Wins to Start Changing Culture Now
